

BIBLE STUDY CORNER

"Behold, the virgin shall be with child and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel, which means, 'God is with us.'"

Matthew 1:23

Reflection: The secular world wants to convince us that we can get along in life without God. There are schools of thought promoting the idea that there is no need to believe in God and that to believe in God is utter foolishness. There are some scholars who believe that they are the masters of their own worlds and that they can find their way to happiness and peace without God. The arrogant and the powerful refute the claim that "God is with us." They are self-autonomous, self-sufficient, and the center of their own world.

Those who recognize their own powerlessness and sense their incompleteness come to believe and trust that "God is with us." They believe in their hearts that there is someone greater to depend on for our existence. They believe that life has a deeper meaning and purpose with God.

God is with us in a variety of ways. God is with us in all of creation. God is with us in sacred Scripture, in the Eucharist, in the Church and sacraments, and in all the acts of charity we offer to the poor and needy everywhere.

We can take a valuable lesson from the poor and powerless. In their humble living, they know that "God is with us." They know that they can find the God of joy and peace in their hearts.

Ponder: What makes me doubt the truth that God is with us?

Prayer: Lord, you are Emmanuel, "God with us." Open the eyes and ears of my heart that I may see your presence in every person I meet, and hear your voice in the cry of the poor.

Practice: Today I will be with God by reading and reflecting on Psalm 24.
