BIBLE STUDY CORNER

[Jesus said to them] "Therefore I tell you, the kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a people

that produces the fruits of the kingdom.".

Matthew 21:43

Reflection: When we dwell in the kingdom of God, our focus is on perfecting our ability to love God with our whole heart, soul, body, and mind, and to love our neighbor as ourselves. If we deliberately withhold love, we move ourselves outside the kingdom of God, for God is love.

At heart, we are good people who genuinely want to do good I the world. We want to play our part in bringing the good news of God's kingdom of love to everyone we meet. At times, however, we close our minds, hearts, ears, and eyes to opportunities to love. We may hold a grudge against someone we feel has hurt us. We may refuse to cooperate within our family, letting others cook, clean, shop, and do errands without offering to help. We may condemn immigrants who don't speak our language instead of finding ways to ease communication. We may try to control the lives of people around us instead of allowing them to make mistakes and find their own way through the maze of life.

Each day we must set our intention on doing the work of love in the world. Each day we must practice treating others with respect. We must act honorably, seeking to be honest and truthful in our dealings with others. We must practice gratitude for all that God does for us, even when the lessons we have to learn may be painful in the moment. We must actively cultivate the fruits of the kingdom: love, compassion, forgiveness, reconciliation, and peace.

Ponder: What fruits do I cultivate with my words, actions, and hehaviors?

Prayer: Lord, I am grateful for your vineyard of love. Remove my shortcomings that I may cultivate your gifts of compassion and peace.
