THE EMPOWERED CAREGIVER SERIES



Building Foundations Caregiving explores the role of caregiver and changes they may experience, building a support team and managing caregiver stress.

Supporting Independence focuses on helping the person living with dementia take part in daily activities, providing the right amount of support and balancing safety and independence while managing expectations.

Communicating Effectively teaches how dementia affects communication including tips for communicating well with family, friends and health care professionals.

Responding to Dementia Related Behaviors details common behavior changes and how they are a form of communication, non-medical approaches to behaviors and recognizing when additional help is needed.

Exploring Care and Support Services examines how best to prepare for future care decisions and changes, including respite care, residential care and end-of life care.

The "Saintly Seven" refers to seven Black Catholic candidates on the path to sainthood in the U.S., often highlighted during Black Catholic History Month in November. The group includes Servant of God Sister Thea Bowman, Venerable Henriette Delille, Venerable Pierre Toussaint, Venerable Mother Mary Lange, Venerable Father Augustus Tolton, Servant of God Julia Greeley, and Servant of God Friar Martin de Porres Maria Ward.

Servant of God Sister Thea Bowman: A Franciscan Sister of Perpetual Adoration who was a prominent educator and evangelist.

Venerable Henriette Delille: A free woman of color who founded the Society of the Holy Family in New Orleans to serve the sick and poor.

Venerable Pierre Toussaint: A formerly enslaved man who was known for his devout faith and charitable work in New York City.

Venerable Mother Mary Lange: A foundress of the Oblate Sisters of Providence, the first religious congregation of African American women in the United States.

Venerable Father Augustus Tolton: The first openly Black Catholic priest in the United States, who served in Chicago.

Servant of God Julia Greeley: An enslaved woman from Colorado who became known for her strong faith and charitable work.

Servant of God Friar Martin de Porres Maria Ward: A Dominican friar in Peru who was known for his love of the poor and his devotion to the Eucharist.
