#### **INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK**

When making decisions, we often struggle with what voice to follow. We acknowledge the presence of God, the existence of the Trinity, the priority of the Gospel, and the virtues and values they embody. Yet, even with all that truth, knowledge, and tradition behind us we think we know better. When confronted with a decision, we easily dismiss what we know we ought and need to do and entertain responses that stem from lesser desires and wants. We eventually may come around and realize that what God asks us to do is what we need to do, even if it wasn't our original intention. God accepts our return to Him with joy. What becomes dishonest is deceiving ourselves, God, and others by originally saying yes to what we know we need (and are asked to do) and willfully doing something else. That is blatant hypocrisy.

## **BIBLE STUDY CORNER**

Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility regard others as better than yourselves. Let each of

you look not to your own interests, but to the interests of others.

Philippians 2:3-4

**Reflection:** We are ambitious people, We are ambitious about our work, keeping up a public image, and succeeding in life. We are ambitious about maintaining our home. We are ambitious about spending time with family members, neighbors, and friends. We are ambitious about exercising, eating healthy, and enjoying life. We tend to be ambitious for experiences that make us happy and give a sense of personal satisfaction and security.

Yet we must be careful not to be poisoned by blind ambition. Blind ambition is a self-inflicted disease; it is a form of self-imprisonment. Blind ambition makes us selfcentered, arrogant, and greedy. We cannot see beyond our own selfish interests and concerns. We have no desire to love. We are incapable of feeling the pain and suffering of others. We are trapped in our loneliness, unhappiness, and despair. We have no meaning and purpose in life. Human ambition without voluntary humility becomes disordered and destructive.

The life of Jesus teaches us how to live the humble life. Jesus is the humble servant of God who always responds with compassion to the needs of people. He never acts out of selfishness or out of the need to dominate others. His only desire is to fulfill the will of God on earth. We are called to be selfless, humble servants of Christ. Our mission in life is to be ambitious in seeking out the poor and responding to them with the compassion of God.

Ponder: When do I act from selfish ambition or conceit?

**Prayer:** Lord, I am grateful for your example of humble service toward others. Help me to be a humble and loving person toward all people.

**Practice:** With a grateful heart I will serve others' needs before my own.
