

#### **BIBLE STUDY CORNER**

The king will say to those at his right hand, "Come, you that are blessed by my Father inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world; for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you

took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me.'

Matthew 26:34-36

Reflection: Jesus is very clear about the concrete actions we must take to serve God in the world. Whenever we make a heartfelt offering of food, drink, hospitality, clothing, care, or our presence to those in need, we answer the call to follow Jesus. Our ability to help is not limited by our physical resources. Our prayers emotional support, spiritual insights, and belief in the power of love and compassion make a positive impact in the lives of those who are suffering. People are made hungry and thirsty, lonely, alienated, ill and imprisoned by any number of situations. It is our calling to discern where our time, talent, and treasure will meet the needs of those who require attention.

When we serve the hungry, thirsty, lonely, alienated, ill, and imprisoned, we acknowledge all people's likeness to God and learn to walk with reverence, respect, and gentleness in the presence of everyone. We allow the love in our hearts to flow out to meet the love in the hearts of others. We get a tiny glimpse into the awesome beauty of the kingdom of God, where all people are welcome and treated with equal dignity, where all are healed and made holy, one people of the one God who loves us without end.

**Ponder:** What prevents me from seeing the face of God in others?

**Prayer**: Lord, I am grateful that you are my gentle shepherd. Show me how to care for your people with the same love and compassion you show me.

**Practice**: With a grateful heart I will feed someone who is hungry.

#### **Black Catholic History Month**

There are six Black Catholics who are on the path to sainthood at the present time.

#### Venerable Pierre Toussaint (1776-1853)



Venerable Pierre Toussaint was born a slave in Haiti. Philanthropist & Founder of many Catholic charitable works. He is buried in St. Patrick's Cathedral in New York City. He is the first layperson to be buried there.

#### Mother Mary Elizabeth Lange (1784-1882)



Mother Mary Lange was the foundress and first Superior General of the Oblate Sisters of Providence (1829-1832), the first congregation of African American women religious in the history of the Catholic Church. She is believed to be Cuban born of Haitian descent.

#### Venerable Henriette Delille (1813-1862)



Venerable Henriette Delille was born in New Orleans, Louisiana, where she lived all of her life. In 1842, she founded the Congregation of the Sisters of the Holy Family. This was the second congregation of African-American women religious in the USA.

#### Fr. Augustus Tolton (1854-1897)



Fr. Augustus Tolton was the first Roman Catholic priest in the United States publicly known to be black when he was ordained in 1886. A former slave who was baptized and reared Catholic, Tolton studied formally in Rome. He was ordained at St. John Lateran (Rome).

#### Julia Greeley (1833 and 1848-1918)



Julia Greeley was bom into slavery, at Hannibal, Missouri, sometime between 1833 and 1848. Freed by Missouri's Emancipation Act in 1865, she joined the Secular Franciscan Order in 1901 and was active in it till her death in 1918. She is buried in Denver's Cathedral Basilica of the Immaculate Conception.

#### Sr. Thea Bowman, FSPA (1937-1990)



Sr. Thea Bowman, FSPA was born in 1937 and reared in Canton, Mississippi. As a child she converted to Catholicism. She was Franciscan Sisters of Perpetual Adoration. During her short lifetime (52 years), she was dedicated to preparing priests and seminarians working in the African-American parishes and institutions in the USA.

#### **Blacks In Catholic History**

November 22<sup>nd</sup> ~ Did You Know... that a black African Catholic, Saint Anthony of Alexandria, is known as the patriarch of Monks?



He was born at Aama, a village south of Memphis, near Thebes. His parents

were rich Christians. Shortly after inheriting his parent's fortune, he sold all his vast fortune and gave the proceeds to the poor, sent his sister to a nunnery and retired to an old ruin of a tomb. He ate only every three or four days and spent his time at manual labor and prayer.
