BIBLE STUDY CORNER

I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people.

Jeremiah 31:33B

Reflection: One of the fastest ways to get a message to someone, share a thought or idea is by text messaging. It is amazing how many text messages are sent each day, connecting people and updating them on a variety of personal, social, and business interests. Text messaging eliminates the interpersonal encounter, removing the components of emotional involvement and physical presence.

In a sense, God text messaged us when the law of God, the law of love, was written on our hearts. Unlike the text messages that flood our cell phones, we cannot erase God's love from our hearts. This is God's permanent law that permeates our mind, heart, soul, and interaction with others. Our thoughts must be inspired with this love. Our spirituality must reflect the spirit of God's love. All our relationships in life must be grounded in love of God and love of neighbor.

The truth is that whatever we say and do, people will be able to read the text message that is written on our hearts and know that it is from God. Since every person on this earth has the law of God written on his or her heart, it means that God desires to be in communion with us, to remain faithful to us, and to care for us. God's text message of love is cellular; it is in our DNA. We cannot ignore the fact that our true nature in God is love. This is the message that goes forth to be shared with all of humanity.

Ponder: Do I feel and act upon the love of God?

Prayer: Lord, your love is written on my heart. May your love inspire and empower me to love people from all walks of life.

Practice: I will pray for a spirit of love; I will fast from hatred of others; I will make an effort to overcome my prejudice of others.
