

VOLUNTEERS: All volunteers who encounter youth and vulnerable adults need to complete online Creating a Safe Environment training, background check and sign a Code of Conduct every three years. To complete the online course, go to dor.org online training.

Requires CASE Training:

- *Eucharistic Ministers
- *Ushers
- *Cantors
- *Lectors
- *Choir Members (only if there are youth members)
- 1. Complete the Online CASE Training, test and PRINT out your Certificate at http://ec.dor.org
- Print and Sign the Volunteer Code of Conduct to be placed with your CASE Certificate
- Complete the Consent for Background Check (bringing your valid ID to our office when turning in the paperwork.)
