

St. Monica Neighborhood Businesses

Jesus, who is my neighbor?

Black History has special meaning in St. Monica's southwest Rochester neighborhood. In 1960, Fr. Charles Hall, who grew up in Immaculate Conception Parish, was ordained Upstate NY's first Black priest.

Charles Anthony Hall was bom in 1931, the first of twelve Hall family children raised on Clarissa Street. He graduated from Aquinas Institute and Epiphany College, a Josephite seminary founded to meet the needs of African Americans. In June 1960 he was ordained at the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, DC.



And said his first Mass at Immaculate Conception Church in Rochester that same month.

Fr. Hall was assigned to teach chemistry at St. Augustine High School in New Orleans. In 1965, he was diagnosed with cancer. He died on Holy Saturday in 1967 at age 36, only 7 years after ordination. He is buried at Holy Sepulchre Cemetery.

Fr. Hall's sisters Roxana Weber and Isabelle Walters continue to attend Immaculate Conception Church. Brother Marty Hall, a florist, once belonged to St. Monica Gospel Choir, and passed in 2022.
