### **BIBLE STUDY CORNER**

Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God; everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. Whoever does

not love does not know God, for God is love.

1 John 4:7-8

Reflection: Love is a powerful force. Love is the foundation of family life. Love brings people together and builds community. Love nurtures and sustains friendships. Love enlightens us to value life. Love moves us to show compassion to those who are suffering and in pain. Love enables us to feed the poor, to visit the sick and the imprisoned, to shelter the homeless, and to welcome the stranger. Love gives us the courage to work for peace and justice. Love humbles us to offer forgiveness to others.

When love is absent from our hearts, we feel empty, afraid, sad, and hopeless. When we refuse to love others, there is conflict and division, violence and war, racial discrimination and hatred, misery and poverty. When we withhold love from the poor, the sick, and the suffering, people die. When we fail to teach our children and youth how to love others, life is endangered.

The resurrection of Jesus is God's gift to humanity. To believe in the resurrection is to believe in God's love as the source and foundation of the universe. The risen Jesus is the living presence of God's love in the world. The universal message of the resurrection is that God's love is available to all people and that we have been given the power to love one another.

There is great hope for us and the whole world. We can overcome all obstacles with love. Believers and unbelievers alike can experience the transforming power of the resurrection and know God when we love one another.

**Ponder:** How do I come to know God?

Prayer: Risen Jesus, you command us to love one another. Help me to show your love to all people.

Practice: Today I will show no partiality and will

treat everyone with love.

### **Parish Pastoral Council**

Immaculate Conception/St. Bridget's Church is seeking volunteers to serve as Parish Pastoral Council members. If interested please see Deacon Rick Rall. The specific purposes of the Pastoral Council are:

- to develop a common vision and purpose, actively advocate for the poor and the powerless, and to extend Christian commitment to the surrounding neighborhoods and communities;
- to orchestrate a statement of mission for the parish community and become the reference point for activity in the parish;
- to provide recommendations for parish priorities, directions and policies through pastoral planning for worship, evangelization, outreach, stewardship, etc.;
- to promote communication, understanding, and collaboration among parish organizations and between the parish, the bishop, the diocese and the universal Church.

Pastoral leadership is a ministry of service. Pastoral leadership and authority cannot be separated from the action of service which builds up community and empowers its members to reach their full individual stature.


Accordingly, Council members must meet the following criteria:

- be fully initiated Roman Catholics in good standing with the Church;
- be registered and supporting members of the parish;
- be participants in parish life and worship;
- be committed to prayer, study, listening and dialogue;
- be committed to giving the time needed for participation; and be aware of and comply with the Parish Conflict of Interest Policy.

In addition, he or she should possess the following gifts necessary for pastoral leadership:

- a desire for spiritual growth in oneself and in the parish;
- eagerness to participate in parish decisions about its direction;
- willingness to listen, speak openly and honestly, and to work toward consensus;
- integrity in articulating what one has heard and what one believes; • the ability to inspire and empower other and to delegate; and
- cooperation, flexibility and openness with people and ideas.

The term of office is three years. Terms should be staggered so Council membership rotates. A member may serve for two consecutive three year terms. After one year of a break in service, a new cycle may commence.



### **Diocesan Missions Sunday**

Next Sunday, May 16th we shall observe Diocesan Missions Sunday. Proclaiming the Gospel is not something we can do once for all, but is an ongoing part of the Church. This is the message of the new evangelization.
